How does it work? A typical Dungeons & Dragons game consists of an "adventure", which is roughly equivalent to a single story. Working together as a group, players direct the actions of their character and their interactions with other characters in the game. The game will help you develop a variety of social and other useful cognitive skills, such as logic, basic mathematics and imagination. A game often continues over a series of meetings to complete a single adventure, and longer into a series of related gaming adventures, called a "campaign". You can build your own character with specific skills and attributes and join an existing party to start a campaign or come up with your own.
