#### About this Apprenticeship

An apprenticeship in a genuine job, with training, meaning apprentices learn and gain skills and professional competencies in their chosen career, whilst receiving a wage.

Apprenticeships are suitable for well-motivated people who are focussed and know which career path they want to follow. They offer high quality work-based training as an alternative to full time study.

This programme is aimed at people who are employed, or are seeking employment. You will need to be 16 years of age or over. Apprenticeships are available at level 2 and level 3.

#### Who is this course for?

An apprenticeship is a genuine job, with training. Apprentices will learn and gain professional competencies in their chosen career, whilst receiving a wage. Apprenticeships are suitable for well-motivated people who are focused and know which career they want to follow. All apprenticeships offer high quality work-based training as an alternative to full time education. From April 2020, the apprenticeship minimum wage is £4.15 per hour. For further information on salaries, visit gov.uk/national-minimum-wage-rates.

#### What is the course duration?

18 Months

#### What is the mode of study?

Employer Premises

#### What qualification will I achieve?

On completion of this course you will receive NVQ Level 4 in Business and Administration; Diploma in the Principles of Business and Administration and, if required, Functional Skills.

#### What skills, knowledge and behaviours will I learn?

- Employment should be for a minimum of 30 hours per week, with training in the workplace
- · Assessor visits in the workplace every 3 4 weeks

### The Basics.



All UK students apply via UCAS

You can choose one course (£22) or up to five courses (£26.50)

Universities & courses have codes, such as 'N77' and 'WW2P'

You upload everything via UCAS, including personal statement

OFFERS: Conditional, Unconditional, Unsuccessful

RESPONSES: Firm, Insurance, Decline

Most important date is that given to you by school/college!



# What is a personal statement?



- 4,000 characters or 47 lines
- Many courses don't hold interviews or request portfolios
- A 'cover letter' that supports their application

# What do they look for?



- **Enthusiasm for their subject**
- Clear structure: 80/20?
- Evidence that they've thought about what you want to do
- Why they are a good candidate

### What to cover



- What bearing do your current studies have on your selection?
- What experiences have you gained from your studies?
- What interests you about the course/subject area?
- Do you have a career goal?
- What skills and attributes do you have?
- What do you do in your spare time?
- Do you have any relevant work/volunteer experience, or any other achievements?

# Work Experience.

Why is it important?

- Two thirds of employers look for graduates with relevant work experience
- Great for boosting CV and shows motivation and commitment
- Helps to gain a better understanding of a potential career



# Open Days.

- Research courses prior
- Speak to academics
- Get a 'feel' for the university/city
- > Prepare questions

## Part 2 – Maintenance Loans



### How is it paid?

Paid to student in instalments

45%\* guaranteed – rest depends on circumstances

Nothing payable upfront

Travel

# Paying it back.

Tuition and maintenance combine into one loan

- Paying your loan back depends on how much you EARN
- You don't pay anything back until earning over £25,000 per year



# Paying it back.


- 9% of what you earn OVER £25,000
- Written off after 40 years
- Paid monthly taken automatically from your paycheque.

- Bank details & your income
- Parent/Guardian financial information from the past year
