How can you support revision in Music?

Understanding Music

- Make sure they know the elements of music and key descriptive words
- Test them to use key words to describe music (2 minute Classic FM Challenge)
- Listen to as much music from the Areas of Study as possible (playlists are recommended)
- Live performances, radio, TV
- Encourage them to identify features that are typical of the style that they can hear
- Make sure they know the set works inside out
- Encourage revision of general theory (e.g. treble clef notation)

Performing Music

- The performance 'exam' will take place <u>by</u> March (there is a provisional date in the calendar but students could record before if they are ready)
- Practice of the instrument and the pieces should be routine. It is not possible to cram revise for performance!
- Encourage short performances to tackle nerves
- Dialogue keep talking about it!

Composing Music

- There is no exam here but keeping a dialogue open will also help here
- Encourage listening in the style of music they are intending to compose
